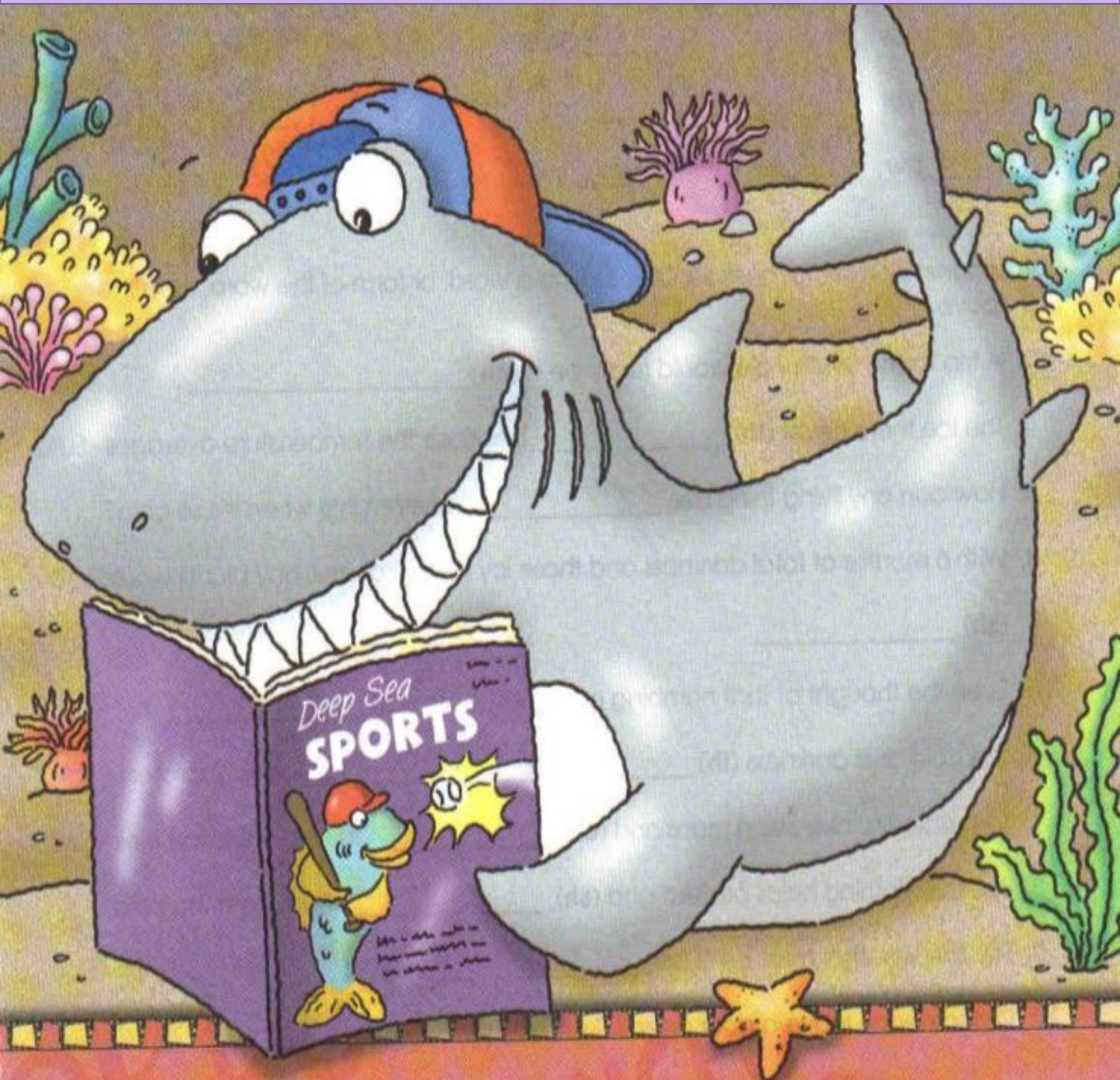

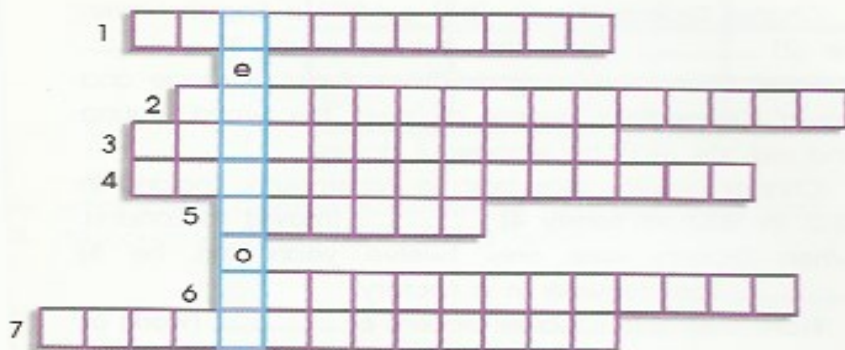

## The History of Washing Machines!

For hundreds of years, sailors washed their clothes like this: they put the dirty clothes in a bag, dropped the bag into the sea and then pulled it along the water! These days washing clothes is much easier, but it wasn't always that way.

The first washing machines were like huge buckets. 1) ..... The dolly was made of wood and had four 'fingers' at the bottom. Later models also had a wringer. 2) ..... Wringers were often dangerous, though, as many people got their hair or fingers caught in them! Thankfully, by the late 1930s, the first fully automatic machine was in use. By the 1960s, these machines were cheaper to buy and this type of washing machine sold millions.
